- The scenic byway is 4.85 miles in length from Wapoo Hall Road to Grimball Road
- Corridor has a diversity of scenic, historic, cultural, and natural resources







# Corridor Management Plan Summary

A Corridor Management Plan (CMP) is a written plan developed by the community along a scenic byway that outlines how to preserve, protect, and enhance the byway's character and assets that define the corridor.





## Purpose of a Corridor Management Plan

- Develop an awareness of the unique scenic and intrinsic qualities
- Community-based plan is a starting dialogue
- An inventory of the defining characteristics, features and resources associated with the byway
- Identify how to preserve the special qualities of the corridor including the live oak canopies, marsh vistas, adjoining open space and historic landscapes
- Develop a guiding vision with goals, recommendations, and implementation strategies moving forward

#### Vision Statement

- A vision statement puts into words the collective ideas a group has about what they want the future to look like and the work they are willing to do to make that future happen.
- At the very first meeting, words such as "protect", "save", "natural", "scenic", and "unique" were mentioned when people described their community and what they wanted to see happen along the Riverland Drive corridor.



#### Vision Statement for Riverland Drive

"To retain the natural beauty, history, and character of the Lowcountry region; balance the needs of motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists; and preserve and protect the environmental and cultural assets for future generations to enjoy."



#### Goals for the Future

- Safeguard What People Value (Protect and enhance the corridor's natural, scenic and historic qualities and features)
- Tell the Stories of the Area (Reveal and interpret the corridor's intrinsic qualities)
- Make Way for Play (Expand the corridor's range of recreational and social opportunities)
- Enjoy the Journey (Promote safe travel that offers a pleasant experience for all users)



#### Goal I: Safeguard What People Value

Protect and enhance the corridor's natural, scenic and historic qualities, and features

- Protect and restore historic, cultural, and archeological resources.
- Protect the oak tree canopy, native plant communities, and vegetation patterns.
- Maintain and enhance scenic views and vistas.
- Ensure future development is compatible with the corridor's unique features and character.



#### Goal 2: Tell The Stories of the Area

Reveal and interpret the corridor's intrinsic qualities

- Identify the varied and unique qualities, places, and features that characterize the Riverland Drive Corridor.
- Provide interpretive information about special places and features.
- Enable visitors to experience scenic vistas and other point of interest.
- Convey and integrate the stories and interpretive messages.



#### Goal 3: Make Way for Play

Expand the corridor's range of recreational and social opportunities

- Promote the wide range of social and recreational opportunities throughout the corridor.
- Maintain and increase public trails and recreational spaces.
- Improve access to and increase the amount of waterrelated recreational activities.
- Expand opportunities to accommodate events, festivals, concerts, especially those that promote the intrinsic qualities of the corridor.



## Goal 4: Enjoy the Journey

Promote safe travel that offers a pleasant experience for all users

- Allow for a range of travel choices (automobile, bus, bicycle, walking)
- Create safe conditions for all travelers and all modes of transportation.
- Make roadway improvements compatible with the corridor's intrinsic qualities.
- Develop a unified and cohesive system of wayfinding and place marker signage.



## Next Steps

- Refinement of Vision Statement, Goals, and Recommendations based on feedback received
- Preparation of Draft Plan Document for public review and comments in August
- Third community meeting on August 21<sup>st</sup> (Location TBD) to review draft plan and provide comments
